

### ACCOMPLISHMENT REPORT ON PROJECT DREAM (Disaster Resilience Education and Advocacy for MSES)

# I. Introduction

The safety of schools is important and DRR aims at reducing the vulnerability to, and impact of disasters on schools. It prepares both teachers and students for potential disasters, thereby reducing the impact of said disaster. As emergencies and disasters, along with their destructive effects, are rising all over the world acquiring knowledge and its uses are regarded as the most effective way to prevent disasters or reduce its effects with the advancement in technology. Disaster education for vulnerable aims to provide knowledge, skills, motivation in individuals and groups to take actions to reduce their vulnerability to disasters. A school with adequate plan for disaster management, which was prepared through a participatory technique and properly integrated into the policies and plans of the community as a whole has major advantages over schools that don't. The level of effective management of disaster might be solely dependent on this plan.

In line with the implementation of DepEd Order No.83, s. 2011 entitled Disaster Preparedness Measures for Schools and DO No. 21, s. 2015 entitled Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Coordination and Information Protocol. Based on the data recorded there are 122 or 39.86% of learners have low level of understanding on the hazards, awareness on safety and preparedness of potential risk. In response to this, capacitating the school personnel is important nowadays in order to strengthen learners' disaster preparedness. Likewise, Marinig South Elementary School will implement the Project DREAM to continuously increase the level of understanding on the hazards, awareness on safety and preparedness of potential risk.

# II. Highlights of accomplishment

Marinig South Elementary School particularly Grade Six learners conducted a classroom-based training under Project DREAM (Disaster Resilience Education and Advocacy for MSES) with the theme "Be Alert & Respond: A Basic First Aid Training for Grade 6 Pupils".

Ms. April K. Terrenal was the resource person on the said activity. The speaker also discussed ways to treat heat exhaustion that might happen in





school and their respective houses. We believe that first aid training will be a valuable asset for our learners. It will surely equip them with the basic skills for emergency situations and provide them with a better understanding of how to respond in emergency scenarios.

The activity was held on May 04, 2023, at Marinig South Elementary school.
