# A NARRATIVE REPORT ON SCHOOL BASED TRAINING ON CONTEXTUALIZATION AND LOCALIZATION OF INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS

#### I. INTRODUCTION

Marinig South Elementary School conducted a School Based Training on Contextualization and Localization of Instructional Materials last June 16, 2023 from 1:00 pm to 4:00 pm. The activity is anchored on the Project PDAT (Professional Development for Aspiring Teachers) and Project URL-Tech (Utilization of Resources for Learners Using Technology of the Enhanced School Improvement Plan and Basic Education Development Plan).

#### II. TRAINING PROPER

The program started with a prayer followed by an opening remark given by Mr. Emmanuel B. Cerda, Principal II. Then, a short introduction about the speaker was given by Mrs. Doris D. Herbosa, Master Teacher I.













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Ms. Jackie Lou A. Almira, PHD, the resource speaker, is the current Education Program Supervisor of Learning Resource Management Section. She was chosen because of her expertise about the topic. She started the session by providing the objectives which are as follows: a. Select appropriate topic in making contextualized reading materials for learners b. Create contextualized reading materials c. Reflect the crafting contextualized materials using a journal. She reported and discussed the topic about Crafting of Contextualized and Localized Reading Materials. She emphasized the parts of a story book and encouraged teachers to write since this can serve as an entry to be a story

writer. During the workshop session, as an output, the participants were given three minutes to write a short story about the simple thing that interests them. The participants actively shared different wonderful, some comical, stories that amazed everyone, even themselves.













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At the latter part of the program, an open forum was given to clear up points or questions. The speaker, Ma'am Almira, humbly answered and generously gave her insights and suggestions. The program concluded with the awarding of certificates and a prayer.


